#### Q1. What is punctuation?

A: Punctuation refers to the marks used in writing to separate sentences and clarify meaning. Examples include full stops, commas, and question marks.

# Q2. What is the rule for using a full stop (.)?

A: A full stop is used at the end of a declarative sentence.

Example:

She is reading a book.

## Q3. When do we use a comma (,)?

A: A comma is used to:

1. Separate items in a list.

Example: I bought apples, oranges, and bananas.

2. After introductory words.

Example: Yes, I will come.

3. To set off a name or direct address.

Example: John, please sit down.

Q4. What is the use of a question mark (?)?

A: A question mark is used at the end of an interrogative sentence.

Example:

What is your name?

## Q5. What is the rule for exclamation marks (!)?

A: An exclamation mark is used to express strong emotions or surprise.

Example:

Wow! This is amazing.

## Q6. What is the rule for quotation marks (" ")?

A: Quotation marks are used to show the exact words spoken or written by someone. Example:

He said, "I will be late today."
